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TAHIRIH JUSTICE CENTER

The Tahirih Justice Center provides the following **FREE** and **CONFIDENTIAL** services for immigrant women and girls fleeing gender-based violence:

LEGAL SERVICES

- Immigration consultation and representation for survivors of domestic violence, trafficking, and violent crimes
- Family law consultation and representation for protective orders, divorce, custody and spousal support
- Referrals to immigration agencies and family law attorneys across the country

SOCIAL SERVICES

- Referrals to shelters, therapists, physicians and food banks
- Consultation on housing, public benefits, employment, childcare, safety planning

SIGNS YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW MAY BE IN AN ABUSIVE RELATIONSHIP*

- Forces you to get permission to eat, pray, talk to family
- Belittles you or tells you you're not a good Muslim spouse or parent
- Threatens to divorce you or marry another spouse
- Forces sexual intercourse on you
- Threatens to take children away from you
- Prevents you from going to the mosque, grocery store, school, or work
- Pushes, hits, or grabs you
- Threatens to report you to immigration or the police
- Takes your paycheck or withholds money from you

STEPS YOU CAN TAKE

1. For emergencies, call 911 and ask for translator in your language
2. Create a safety plan with the help of a domestic violence counselor
3. Go to court and obtain a protective order
4. Document abuse through a journal, photographs, and e-mail archives
