U VISA ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS CHECKLIST

- □ **Form G-28** Notice of Entry of Appearance as Attorney (fill in with responsible Tahirih attorney's information)
- □ Form I-485 Application to Register Permanent Residence or Adjust Status
- **Form G-325A** Biographic Information (one original copy)
 - List of residences for past 5 years
 - List of employment for past 5 years
- □ Check or money order in the amount of \$1,070.00 for the I-485 filing fee (\$985.00) and the biometrics fee (\$85.00), made out to U.S. Department of Homeland Security <u>OR</u> Fee waiver application (USCIS Form I-912)
- □ **Four passport-style photos** of applicant with name and A# on the back (two for the I-485 Application and two for the I-765 Work Permit Renewal Application)
- **Form I-693** Report of Medical Examination and Vaccination Record
 - A <u>list of civil surgeons</u> (doctors who have been certified by USCIS to conduct medical examinations) can be found through the <u>USCIS</u> <u>website</u>)
- □ **Form I-765** Application for Employment Authorization (include if your client's U visa will expire in less than six months)
 - Copy of I-765 approval notice and current work permit
 - No filing fee is required for this application; file under (c)(9) category for pending adjustment
 - **PRACTICE TIP**: This form may be submitted concurrently with the I-485 or at a later time. If filed at a later time, you will need to include the I-485 receipt notice.
- □ Copy of applicant's **birth certificate**, with certified translation if applicable
- □ Client's **affidavit/declaration**. The declaration should include statements re:
 - Continuous physical presence
 - No unreasonable refusal to assist law enforcement since U visa grant
 - Lack of participation in Nazi persecution, genocide, or the commission of any acts of torture or extrajudicial killing (no inadmissibility under INA §212(a)(3)(E))
 - Discretionary factors

Evidence of U Nonimmigrant Status

□ U visa approval notice (Form I-797, Notice of Action), which includes Form I-94 Arrival-Departure Record

- o I-918A Approval Notice for derivatives, which includes Form I-94
 - Note: Derivatives who consular processed will either have a Form I-94 in their passport or electronically stored on DHS' website; the I-94s began to be stored electronically around late 2013/early 2014
- □ I-192 Waiver Approval Notice (only applicable if client needed a waiver)
- □ **I-539 approval notice** (only applicable if your client received an extension of his or her U visa status)

Evidence of Three Years of Continuous Physical Presence

- □ Copy of applicant's valid **passport** all pages
 - Verify with the client that her passport is not expired. If she has obtained a new passport since her U nonimmigrant status was obtained, include a copy of both the expired and valid passports in the Adjustment of Status filing.
- □ Additional evidence may include,
 - o tax records
 - bank account statements (this is often the easiest way to prove physical presence, since clients can request it from their banks)
 - o employment records or letter(s) from employers
 - o rent or mortgage payments, lease agreements
 - o school enrollment records
 - o utility or phone bills
 - o birth certificates of children
 - o medical records
 - o Shopping receipts/proof of commercial transactions
 - Declarations of applicant's relatives/friends/etc.
- □ If the client has departed from the US, documentation regarding the departure and reentry (date, place, length and manner or departure; date and place of return)

Evidence of No Unreasonable Refusal to Cooperate After U Visa Grant

□ Newly executed USCIS Form I-918, Supplement B

<u>or</u>

- Affidavit describing efforts to obtain a newly executed USCIS Form I-918, Supplement B; and
- Evidence regarding any requests to provide assistance and client's response to such request

or

□ Evidence that the criminal case was completed at the time the original U visa application was filed (original Form I-918, Supplement B signed by law enforcement as well as any criminal documents (i.e. court documents) which show that the criminal case was concluded.

Evidence Relating to Discretion

Positive discretionary evidence is important to include when your client has negative factors in her history, in particular since the grant of her U visa.

- □ I-192 approval notice
- □ Client's declaration
- Letters of support (from neighbors, friends, child's teacher, pastor, employer, etc.)
- U.S. citizen children's birth certificates
- □ Evidence of volunteerism
