I was subject to physical, emotional, and sexual abuse ranging from strangulation, blows to the face, humiliation (forced public nudity), rape, and getting cut with shanks. My partner, _____, did this to me. He threatened me often and told me that he would kill me if I left him. I believe that he mistreated me because he thought that I was his "woman" and that he was entitled to do what he wanted to me. He also hurt me whenever I tried to leave him or do anything against his orders so I believe that he hurt me in order to punish me for asserting my independence.

His attacks were vicious and sometimes life threatening. At one point, he stabbed me with a knife and covered my face with a pillow causing me to lose consciousness, my lung to collapse, and, my body to slip into a coma. _____ has made repeated threats against my life.
