TAHIRIH STATEMENT ON MASS SHOOTINGS AND HATE CRIME IN EL PASO

The Tahirih Justice Center stands in solidarity with the communities of El Paso, Texas and Dayton, Ohio that were impacted by the weekend's heinous acts of violence. In response, Archi Pyati, Tahirih Chief of Policy, issued the following statement:

"We mourn the tragic loss of life in two horrifying shootings that occurred over the weekend, both despicable acts of violence. In particular, as an organization that works with and for immigrant survivors of violence seeking protection in the United States, we are shaken by the targeting of immigrant communities by the El Paso shooter. The shooter posted his motivations online, echoing the anti-immigrant, racist rhetoric that now floods our national media and social media on a daily basis. This and so many other acts of hatred and violence toward immigrants and other minorities, along with many real, harmful policies issued by the administration in quick succession, create a climate of fear for immigrants, including survivors. We must, as a nation, do better than this."
